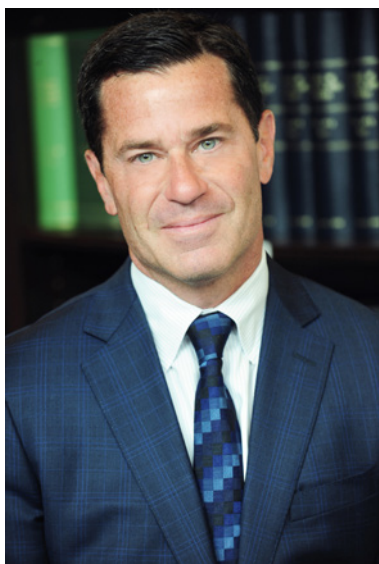


Presidential Guest Speaker - *Anthony Miniaci, MD*

Anthony Miniaci, MD, is a staff physician at Cleveland Clinic’s Center for Sports Health in Cleveland, Ohio as well as at Cleveland Clinic Canada’s Sports Health Team in Toronto. In Canada, he provides orthopaedic consultations to patients who have knee and shoulders issues that may require surgery.

Dr. Miniaci attended medical school at University of Western Ontario and practiced in Toronto, Ontario, Calgary, Alberta and Bern, Switzerland before becoming a staff physician at Cleveland Clinic’s Centre for Sports Health in Cleveland, Ohio. While in Cleveland, Dr. Miniaci has been the head team physician for the Cleveland Browns and has treated athletes from all of over world. While practicing in Canada, he was a full professor at the University of Toronto, an active member of the Canadian Orthopaedic Association, an orthopaedic consultant for the Toronto Blue Jays and team physician for the London Tigers Baseball Club.

Dr. Miniaci brings a wealth of experience and expertise to patients and has received top medical accolades and research grants from a variety of prestigious organizations. Most recently, Dr. Miniaci was ranked in the top 1% of orthopedic surgeons in the United States by *U.S. News and World Report*.



Foundation Guest Speaker - *Brian Cole MD*

Dr. Brian Cole is an orthopedic sports medicine surgeon at Midwest Orthopaedics at Rush and a professor of orthopaedics, Anatomy and Cell Biology at Rush University Medical Center. Dr. Cole is managing partner of Midwest Orthopaedics and is the department’s associate chairman and the section head of the Cartilage Research and Restoration Center.

He received an MD and MBA from the University of Chicago, completed his orthopedic residency at the Hospital for Special Surgery at Cornell Medical Center, and a sports medicine fellowship at the University of Pittsburgh. His professional career outside of academia includes serving as team physician for the Chicago Bulls, co-team physician for the Chicago White Sox, and a team physician for the Chicago Fire, Chicago Dogs, and DePaul University. He has served as co-host for 10 years on the radio talk-show Sports Medicine Weekly originally on ESPN and currently on 670 TheScore – Chicago Sports Radio.

He is the Chairman of Surgery at Rush Oak Park Hospital and leads the Rush Orthopedic Master’s Program. Dr. Cole is the 2020 President of the Arthroscopy Association of North America. He also holds several other leadership positions in national and international orthopedic societies.

Honors awarded to Dr. Cole range from the “Best Doctors in America” since 2004 and “Top Doctor” in Chicagoland since 2003. In 2006, he was featured on the cover of *Chicago Magazine* as “Chicago’s Top Doctor.” In 2009, he was selected as NBA Team Physician of the Year and *Orthopedics This Week* has named Dr. Cole as one of the top 20 sports medicine, knee and shoulder specialists repeatedly over the last 5 years as selected by his peers.

Dr. Cole’s research interests include cartilage restoration, therapeutic biologics and regenerative medicine, and minimally invasive surgical techniques for the treatment of the knee, elbow, and shoulder. He has published more than 1,000 articles and 8 textbooks on orthopedic surgery and sports medicine, has lectured nationally and internationally on more than 2,000 occasions and has appeared as an expert on several TV documentaries.



Hughston Legacy Speaker - James R. Andrews, MD

Dr. James Andrews is one of the founding members of Andrews Sports Medicine and Orthopaedic Center in Birmingham, AL. He is also co-founder of the American Sports Medicine Institute (ASMI) a non-profit institute dedicated to injury prevention, education, and research in orthopaedic and sports medicine. Dr. Andrews continues to serve as chairman of the board and medical director of ASMI. Dr. Andrews is also a founding partner and medical director of the Andrews Institute in Gulf Breeze, FL. He is president and chairman of the board of the Andrews Research and Education Foundation also dedicated to prevention, education, and research at the Andrews Institute.

Dr. Andrews is known and recognized for his skills as an orthopaedic surgeon as well as his scientific and clinic research contributions in knee, shoulder, and elbow. In addition, he has made major presentations around the world, and has authored numerous scientific articles and books.

Dr. Andrews graduated from Louisiana State University (LSU) in 1963, completed LSU School of Medicine in 1967 and completed his orthopaedic residency at Tulane Medical School in 1972. He had surgical fellowships in sports medicine at the University of Virginia School of Medicine in 1972 and at the University of Lyon, Lyon, France in 1972.

Dr. Andrews is a member of the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery and the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons. He is the Past President of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine and also served on that board as its treasurer and its secretary. He has served on the board of directors of the Arthroscopy Association of North America as well as the International Knee Society. At present, Dr. Andrews serves as medical director and orthopaedic surgeon for Auburn University Intercollegiate Athletics and Senior Orthopaedic Consultant at the University of Alabama. Dr. Andrews serves on the Medical and Safety Advisory Committee of USA Baseball and on the Board of Little League Baseball, Inc.



Hunter Memorial Speaker - Colonel Francis G. O'Connor, MD

COL(R) Francis G. O'Connor is the recipient of multiple military awards including the Order of Military Medical Merit and the Army "A" Proficiency-designator. He graduated from the Army Command and General Staff College in 2001; he was selected for AOA academic recognition in 2005. His military medals include the Defense Meritorious Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Meritorious Service Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Joint Army Commendation Medal with Oak Leaf Cluster, the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal and the Parachutist Badge. Dr. O'Connor is additionally the recipient of several civilian awards for excellence in sports medicine research and education including the Korey Stringer Institute's Lifesaving Research Award, presented by the NFL and Gatorade in 2012, an ACSM Citation Award in 2016, and the American Medical Society of Sports Medicine Founder's Award in 2017.

COL O'Connor graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1981 with a Bachelor of Science degree. Dr. O'Connor earned his degree in Medicine from the State University of New York, Syracuse in 1985, and obtained a Master's in Public Health from Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) in 2005.

He completed a residency in family medicine at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center in Syracuse, NY in 1988, and a sports medicine fellowship at the Nirschl Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Center, Arlington, VA in 1992. He is board certified in family medicine, sports medicine, and musculoskeletal ultrasound. He is currently the medical director, Consortium for Health and Military Performance, and a professor in the Department of Military and Emergency Medicine, USUHS.

COL O'Connor has been a leader in sports medicine education and research with the military for over 25 years. He has authored over 100 peer reviewed articles in scientific journals and numerous book chapters/technical reports/health promotion resources for the military. In addition, Dr. O'Connor is the editor of 10 texts on sports medicine including, the *Textbook of Running Medicine*, and *Sports Medicine for the Primary Care Physician 4th Edition* and *ACSM's Sports Medicine: A Comprehensive Review*. He is considered an authority on running injuries and a subject-matter expert in the areas of exertional heat illness and exertional rhabdomyolysis.

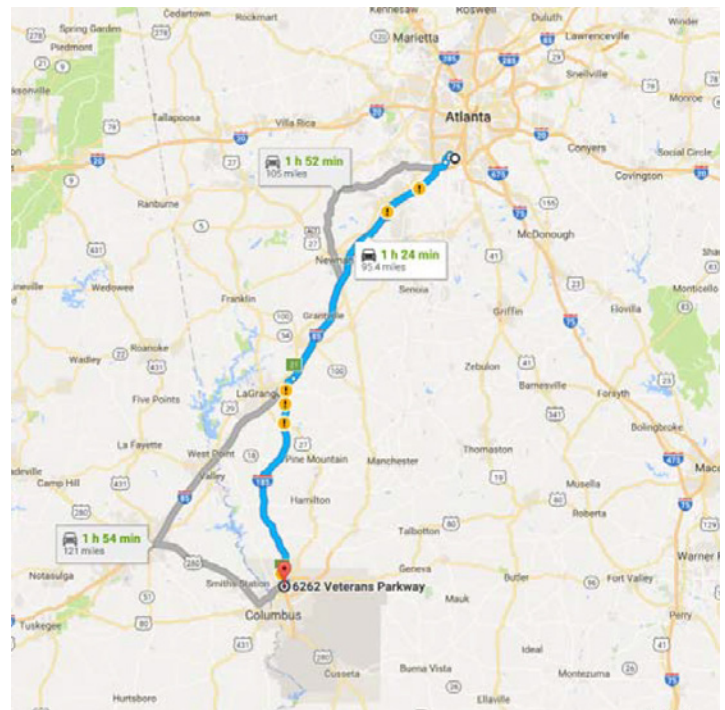

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS



Experience the National Infantry Museum and Soldier Center at Patriot Park

Here you can trace the footsteps of the Infantryman from the Revolutionary War to events in the Persian Gulf and battles in between. Visitors can see displays of edged weapons, uniforms, and vehicles of the U.S. Infantry. While you're here you can experience a movie in the IMAX Theater or have target practice in the virtual rifle range. The museum includes a gift shop and the Fife and Drum restaurant.

Discover Oxbow Meadows Environmental Learning Center

Tread lightly amid native flora and fauna at Oxbow Meadows, where nature takes its course. Ramble among ponds and vegetation where butterflies, birds, turtles, and dragonflies—and the occasional snake or two—reign supreme. Get hands-on at the Environmental Learning Center and experience the region's natural history.



Historic Westville

Westville redefines "living history" by providing experiences that transform the way we think about the past and remind us that history lives in our thoughts, actions, and understanding of the present. Through exhibits, live interpretations, demonstrations, and hands-on activities, you can curate your own museum experience. Westville is an accumulation of nearly a century of preserving the past. Westville covers the entire 19th century and is organized into four interpretive areas, designed to examine diverse experiences due to race, class, and gender.

Blast Off at the CSU Coca-Cola Space Science Center

Walk into the Space Center and discover a universe of cosmic wonder and high tech exploration. Travel to unknown worlds through NASA exhibits and interactive displays that educate as well as entertain. Visitors of all ages find themselves right in the middle of the action. Experience the unique, state-of-the-art Omnisphere Planetarium Theatre with feature programs, laser concerts, star shows, and children's films. Team building is at its best with a customized "Mission to Mars".



Set Sail at the National Civil War Naval Museum at Port Columbus

The nation's only Civil War Naval Museum gives visitors a chance to discover the most pivotal period of naval history. Featured exhibits—follow Admiral Farragut onto a replica of his flagship, USS Hartford. Go below deck and see where the sailors slept, ate, and passed time. The famous ironclad CSS Albermarle and brace yourself for combat. Then, stand at the bow of the CSS Jackson and view the 225-foot long hull of the largest surviving scratch-made ironclad in the world.

Be Starstruck at the Springer Opera House

Also known as the State Theatre of Georgia, the Springer Opera House has been a leading Southern cultural institution for over 135 years. As you stroll from the gaslit street into the splendid Edwardian Grand Lobby, you can easily imagine the 19th Century merchants, tradesmen, farmers, steamboat passengers, and arts patrons streaming into the theatre eager to catch their first glimpse of Oscar Wilde, Ma Rainey, or Lillie Langtry.



Columbus, GA, Whitewater

The world's longest urban whitewater course flows through Uptown—the original heart of Columbus. This course includes class 3 and 4 rapids over 2 miles and takes you past historic downtown and along the banks of Georgia and Alabama. This river restoration project provides excellent whitewater conditions, but also re-establishes the natural habitat of many indigenous species, including the shoal bass, fresh water mussel, and spiderlilly. Enjoy the Blue Heron Adventure as well; a dual zip-line across the Chattahoochee River!
