

# Presidential Guest Speaker – Felix H. Savoie, MD

Dr. Felix H. "Buddy" Savoie is an internationally recognized expert in the areas of shoulder and elbow surgery and sports medicine. He has been recognized as an integral member of virtually every respected organization relating to shoulder and elbow surgery, arthroscopy, and sports medicine. Dr. Savoie has held numerous leadership positions and served as president for several organizations including the Arthroscopy Association of North America (2010), American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons (2016), Orthopaedic Learning Center (2016), and Louisiana Orthopaedic Association (2016). He served as the 90th President of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons. In addition to building a successful clinical and surgical practice, Dr. Savoie has devoted his career to grow and advance the field of orthopaedics. He has trained hundreds of medical students, residents, and fellows, including a host of surgeons who visit from across the world to observe and rotate with him year-round. He has authored more than 1,000 publications and continues to develop new academic and clinical research using his own data, alongside other international innovators.



Hughston Legacy Speaker – Kurt E. Jacobson, MD, FACS

Kurt E. Jacobson, MD, FACS, is certified by the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery with a subspecialty certification in sports medicine. Dr. Jacobson earned his medical degree at Tulane University School of Medicine and completed an orthopaedic surgery residency at the University of Michigan Medical Center. Under the guidance of Jack C. Hughston, MD, Dr. Jacobson completed a sports medicine fellowship at the Hughston Foundation.

In addition to general orthopaedics, Dr. Jacobson specializes in sports medicine and knee injuries and has over 35 years of experience in the field. He has served as the head team physician at both the collegiate and high school levels. At Valdosta State University, he served as head team physician for over 30 years and has 4 championship rings. He provides specialty expertise for athletes at all levels with both operative and nonoperative solutions, and he offers guidance and management of orthopaedic conditions and injury prevention.

Dr. Jacobson was the medical director for Piedmont Northside Hospital rehabilitation unit for more than 20 years. His other administrative roles include serving as the Hughston Clinic president since 2016, and chief medical officer of Hughston Clinic and Jack Hughston Memorial Hospital.

# **2024 GUEST SPEAKERS**



**Hunter Memorial Speaker** – Ron Courson, ATC, PT, SCS, NRAEMT, CSCS

Ron Courson currently serves as Executive Associate Athletic Director – Sports Medicine with the University of Georgia Athletic Association. He joined the University of Georgia in May of 1995, and is currently an adjunct instructor in the department of kinesiology, teaching in the athletic training education program. He serves as a clinical instructor teaching physical therapy students from schools throughout the country. He is active in sports medicine research and education, having authored a number of professional papers and textbook chapters. He has served as lead or co-author with the NATA on position papers for emergency preparation, exertional heat illness, management of sudden cardiac arrest, management of head and cervical spine injuries, MRSA, and medical time out. Ron co-chaired the national Spine Injuries in Sport Group, developing evidence-based medicine protocols for pre-hospital care of the spine injured athlete. He developed the nation's first Athletic Medicine Review Board, he has testified before Congress as well as the Knight Commission, and served on the White House "Stop the Bleed" Hemorrhage Control National Education Initiative.




**Baker Memorial Speaker** – Peter A. Indelicato, MD

Dr. Indelicato is currently an Emeritus Professor of Sports Medicine in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the University of Florida. During his tenure, he has served as the Head Team Physician of the Florida Gators for 35 years, the Associate Team Physician for the NFL Miami Dolphins for 9 years, and the Wayne Huizenga Professor of Sports Medicine at the university for more than 20 years. Dr. Indelicato has served as the 40th president of the AOSSM. He also has served as the Chair of the Commercial Relations Committee for the AOSSM and now serves as the Society's Corporate Relations Liaison. Over the course of his career he has authored over 60 articles on the ACL with his main area of research focused on knee ligament injuries.

He was given the Dr. Robert Cade Sports Medicine Person of the Year Award in 2007, the Jack Hughston Award by the SEATA in 2015, the Distinguished Southern Orthopedic Surgeon Award by

the SOA in 2016, and the Gwinnett Pioneer of Sports Medicine Award that same year. At the Annual AOSSM meeting in 2016, he received the Robert E. Leach Sports Medicine Leadership Award in recognition and appreciation for his outstanding and meritorious service to sports medicine. Later that same year, he was given the coveted Jack Wheatley Award by the National Athletic Trainers Association for a lifetime of outstanding contributions that directly impact healthcare in the area of athletics and athletic training. In 2019, Dr. Indelicato was inducted in the AOSSM Hall of Fame, the highest honor given to a society member recognizing their significant contributions to the specialty of sports medicine.



## 75th Anniversary Speaker – Bernard F. Morrey, MD

Bernard F. Morrey, MD, is the emeritus chair of the Department of Orthopaedics at The Mayo Clinic and holds the rank as former Krehbiel Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Mayo and Professor of Orthopaedics at the University of Texas Health Center, San Antonio. He is a Past President of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, of the American Orthopaedic Association (AOA), and of the American Shoulder and Elbow Surgeons. He has been the chair of the Board of Trustees of the *Journal of Bone and Joint Surgery* and of the *Journal of Shoulder and Elbow Surgery*. He served for 8 years on the Board of Governors of the Mayo Clinic.

Dr. Morrey, is a member of numerous national and international orthopaedic organizations, is a Fulbright Scholar, holds 9 patents, and has authored 15 major textbooks translated into 6 languages. He has authored over 460 peer-reviewed publications. He was the personal orthopaedic surgeon to the senior President and Mrs. Barbara Bush. He has been named a distinguished alumnus of the Mayo Clinic, and of the University of Texas Medical Branch, Galveston. In 2023, he was designated as a "Pillar of Orthopaedics" by the AOA.

Dr. Morrey was reared in Ft. Worth, Texas and, after working at NASA as an aerospace engineer on the Apollo mission, he attended medical school at the University of Texas Medical Branch. He completed his residency at Mayo Clinic Rochester concurrently receiving a Master's degree in Biomechanics from the University of Minnesota. After 2 years of service in the Air Force, where he was awarded the Meritorious Service Award, he conducted his surgical practice at Mayo from 1978 -2009, and continues part time at the University of Texas Health Center, San Antonio.



Get hands-on at the Environmental Learning Center and experience the region's natural history.





### **Historic Westville**

Westville redefines "living history" by providing experiences that transform the way we think about the past and remind us that history lives in our thoughts, actions, and understanding of the present. Through exhibits, live interpretations, demonstrations, and hands-on activities, you can curate your own museum experience. Westville is an accumulation of nearly a century of preserving the past. Westville covers the entire 19th century and is organized into four interpretive areas, designed to examine diverse experiences due to race, class, and gender.

## Blast Off at the CSU Coca-Cola Space Science Center

Walk into the Space Center and discover a universe of cosmic wonder and high tech exploration. Travel to unknown worlds through NASA exhibits and interactive displays that educate as well as entertain. Visitors of all ages find themselves right in the middle of the action. Experience the unique, state-of-the-art Omnisphere Planetarium Theatre with feature programs, laser concerts, star shows, and children's films. Team building is at its best with a customized "Mission to Mars".





## Set Sail at the National Civil War Naval Museum at Port Columbus

The nation's only Civil War Naval Museum gives visitors a chance to discover the most pivotal period of naval history. Featured exhibits—follow Admiral Farragut onto a replica of his flagship, USS Hartford. Go below deck and see where the sailors slept, ate, and passed time. The famous ironclad CSS Albermarle and brace yourself for combat. Then, stand at the bow of the CSS Jackson and view the 225-foot long hull of the largest surviving scratch-made ironclad in the world.



Also known as the State Theatre of Georgia, the Springer Opera House has been a leading Southern cultural institution for over 135 years. As you stroll from the gaslit street into the splendid Edwardian Grand Lobby, you can easily imagine the 19th century merchants, tradesmen, farmers, steamboat passengers, and arts patrons streaming into the theatre eager to catch their first glimpse of Oscar Wilde, Ma Rainey, or Lillie Langtry.





### Columbus, GA, Whitewater

The world's longest urban whitewater course flows through Uptown—the original heart of Columbus. This course includes class 3 and 4 rapids over 2 miles and takes you past historic downtown and along the banks of Georgia and Alabama. This river restoration project provides excellent whitewater conditions, but also re-establishes the natural habitat of many indigenous species, including the shoal bass, fresh water mussel, and spiderlilly. Enjoy the Blue Heron Adventure as well; a dual zip-line across the Chattahoochee River!
